## A description of how non-attendance is managed by the school: *8

Islamic College of Brisbane collects attendance data on a per period basis via Teacher Kiosk to ensure an improved standard of care for our students. This has been facilitated via a School Management System called Tassweb software hosted by our school. In the case of no return form the parents then the system generates a letter which is posted to the parents.
