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### From the Principal



Assalamu Alaikum Wa Rahmatullahi Wa Barakatuhu Firstly, I would like to thank the production team of AN-NASEEHA for their hard work in capturing the essence of another very busy year which can be clearly seen by turning over the pages of this magazine to witness the achievements of the Islamic College of Brisbane over 2016. ICB is 21 years old this

year. Tributes to those who have helped the college get to this stage of its development will be fully acknowledged when ICB is in its twenty-fifth (25th) year. However, I am sure that those who have made a contribution over the years are looking on with pride to the way in which the college has developed to this stage. In 2016 ICB has an enrolment of 1036 students, 75 teaching staff and 21 non-teaching staff.

ICB has undergone significant changes to its management and administration structure over the last two years. Prior to 2016, ICB was one of the AFIC (Australian Federation of Islamic Councils) schools in a nationwide system. The other schools were Malek Fahd Islamic School (Greenacre NSW) with two other Campuses at Hoxton Park (Liverpool – NSW) and Beaumont Hills (NSW); the Islamic School of Canberra (ACT), the Islamic College of Melbourne (Victoria), the Islamic College of South Australia and Langford Islamic College (Western Australia). From the beginning, AFIC exercised centralised control through its constitution and the constitutions of the Boards of each of its member schools. However, the new Australian Education Act of 2013 required that each of the schools become independent of AFIC.

ICB is now responsible for its own Governance and today ICB has its own Board (ICBL) with two key Advisory Committees, CPAC (College Parent Advisory Committee) and the Finance and Infrastructure Advisory Committee. ICBL is now responsible for its own Financial and Administrative arrangements. There are now no AFIC signatories to the school Bank Accounts and ICBL has appointed its own Auditor and makes provision for its own insurance. In other words, ICBL is responsible for managing the Strategies, Policies and Risks associated with the future direction of ICB. The Principal is responsible for implementing this direction and is assisted in day to day operations by CPAC.

AFIC does, however, have one remaining function.
AFIC remains the landlord because it owns the land on which the school is built and therefore ICBL pays rent at commercial value.

This shift has not come about without considerable effort on behalf of key personnel. I wish to pay tribute to Ismail Cajee (Board chair); Maryam Kissane (CPAC Chair), the College Senior Management Team (Mr. Shariff - Deputy Principal; Mrs. Ashraf – Head of Primary; Ian Martineau – Head of Secondary and Sharon Lam – Business Manager) and Orhan Camkara – ICT Manager for their significant contribution in achieving this new direction. I would also like to pay tribute to the remainder of the College Staff for the continued academic, social and spiritual development of students while this change has been taking place. My thanks also to the wider school community for their continuing belief in ICB at a time when the required changes attracted considerable media attention. Your patience while we have had to make infrastructure changes such as the Internal and External Roadworks and curriculum changes to become fully compliant with the Australian National Curriculum is acknowledged. The future of ICB is now assured. Therefore, what are the projections for the future? The College Architect (Kerry O'Rourke) has prepared a Master Plan for a future college of 2200 students and is in the final stages of preparation of a Development Approval to accomplish this. The first stage will be the construction of eighteen (18) new classrooms at the first stage of the New High School. This will be most welcome as our building program has been placed on hold while the required changes have been taking place.

To the Graduating Year 12 class of 2016 I wish the very best for their future endeavours and to all a well-deserved break over the Summer Vacation.

### Chairman's Report

I thank Allah SWT for giving me the opportunity to serve as your Chairman of ICB. The Islamic College of Brisbane is the largest Islamic school in the Brisbane region. It currently supports over 1000 students from year 1 to year 12. Historically, the school has developed and nurtured an excellent crop of students and this year was no

different. I am proud of this year's academic achievements, which has cemented our college as one of the outstanding academic institutions of its kind in Queensland.

I have now served as Chairman for just over a year and am proud that, with he help of the Almighty, we have managed to weather severe storms to place the school on the right path towards long term sustainable success. As most of you are aware, our school faced significant challenges during 2016, mainly related to a "show cause notice" issued to the school. To align the school to the requirements of the Education department, we have had to change the governance, financial and operational structure of the school. This we have done successfully. In particular:

- The school has cut the umbilical AFIC cord and is now operating as a completely independent school. Your school now has a new Board of highly qualified individuals who are actively participating in the affairs of the school.
- We have improved the financial functions of the school to improve controls and processes. A dedicated business development manager now oversees critical reporting and governance functions.

Having resolved the issues plaguing the school, the Board and I as Chairman are confident that we have a sound foundation to grow our school and nurture the next generation of Muslim students. A key focus is to now put in place the right strategy to take our school forward. As Chairman, I invite community members and stakeholders to participate and contribute to the future of the school. It is an exciting time for all of us.

### Head of Primary



This year has brought forth many challenges for the Primary School including curriculum planning. At our very core, we believe that every child is unique. Since last year, our teachers have been working tirelessly on their planning to provide for individual children, acknowledging that they learn at different rates and have different learning styles. I would

like to take this opportunity to thank Ms Lynda Rifai and Mrs Zeena Ackland who have been leading the teachers to plan in accordance with the mandated requirements of the Australian Curriculum. I would also like to acknowledge the work put in by our Primary teachers in planning, implementing and assessing students' outcomes along with improving their teaching strategies. During the year, our Primary staff were engaged in several professional learning opportunities to develop and extend our skills, as educators, to design learning tasks that allow learners to better demonstrate their understanding. As we focus on each child developing to their potential and we strive to provide the best education programs possible sometimes, we are too preoccupied with marks. Within this highly competitive environment, students may forget that they come to school, not to get marks, but to learn. In our rapidly changing world, the most important skill will be learning how to learn and how to re-learn, sometimes working independently on our own and sometimes working collaboratively with others. Every child has his/her own distinctive attributes. It's our job to help them discover and grow those attributes so that they can become the very best human being they are capable of becoming, who will help to make the world a better place.

Interactions that occur daily among students can generate conflict that may adversely affect teaching, learning and school effectiveness. Conflicts arise in the classroom, library, school bus, playground, while standing in line, and any place where children gather. It occurs when people have different needs or views of a situation. Teasing, exclusion, friendship problems, rumours, property issues, fighting are usually common conflicts in schools. The ways that we (teachers, parents, carers) respond to children's conflicts have powerful effects on their behaviour and skill development. Effective conflict resolution requires children to apply a combination of well-developed social and emotional skills. These include skills for managing feeling, understanding others, communicating effectively and making decisions. Children need our guidance to learn these skills. Learning to use these skills effectively

takes practice and maturity. Guiding children through the conflict resolution steps helps them feel involved. It shows them how effective conflict resolution can work so that they can start to build their own skills. For any conflict situation, we urge parents not to take it upon themselves to reprimand other students. If incidents occur, parents need to contact the classroom teacher or management who will attend to the concerns. Parents, carers and teaching staff can help children to see conflict as a shared problem that can be solved by understanding both points of view and finding a solution that everyone is happy with.

In conclusion, I would like to thank everyone for a great year. I also would like to acknowledge our parents for their support and for entrusting us with their children. Most important of all, I thank our Primary students for doing their best, getting involved, contributing and striving for improvement. I wish you all a relaxing and reinvigorating break and look forward to seeing you in 2017, Inshallah!

### Head of Secondary



Long ago (about twelve months) in a faraway land (Malaysia) a young educator (maybe not so young) saw an advertisement for a **Head of Secondary** School at the Islamic College of Brisbane. He had seen a number of similar ads for similar positions at established and better known schools. What attracted our not-sovoung educator to the ad was that there was a

real opportunity to lead other educators in shaping school improvement. In an established school he may have been stepping into someone else's shoes. I am afraid that is where the fairy-tale ends. Whilst ICB offered opportunity, it also offered significant challenge. Fortunately, our young educator was up for the challenge and recognised that Rome was not built in a day. Flash forward twelve months and the journey is well underway. Many of the challenges are still there but solutions are being created.

Schools are inherently complicated places. The stakeholders are numerous and, quite rightly, place great emphasis on the importance on high quality education. School leaders have to juggle the sometimes conflicting expectations from the various stakeholder groups (students, parents, teachers, government etc). It is therefore vital that school leaders have a clear vision for their school. Much of the first part of 2016 was spent conducting a 'renovator's audit'; what do we keep, what do we get rid of and what do we change? Central to this process was creating and reinforcing the vision for the College. We aim to be a high functioning Islamic Independent School. At the June CPAC meeting I presented some of our plans. Central to that presentation was our first attempt at creating a 'Learner Profile'. Two of the five areas of that profile were Academic (Personal Best, Intrinsic Drive and Alternative Pathways) and Social Emotional (Well-Being, Social Skills and Resilience). Whilst the other three areas (Spiritual, Physical and Citizenship) are moving forward but Academic and Well-Being are the two areas where we are further advanced.

Whilst there are some very practical strategies that we have already implemented to improve Academic outcomes; alternative pathways, career education and using data to inform practice are all innovations that have been introduced. The strategy that we feel has the greatest potential, is the recognition that a common teaching and learning framework was necessary for consistency. Research shows that there is greater difference in student outcomes within school than between schools. We have already had two workshops

leading to ICB becoming a Visible Learning School. These workshops have included both small groups of Primary and Secondary staff and in January the entire teaching staff will be taken through the Foundation programme as the start of our 'whole school' journey. Professor John Hattie's work on what really makes a difference to student outcomes, is very powerful and grounded in extensive research.

Our Well Being journey started with a survey conducted via University of Melbourne. The data from the survey laid the foundation for engaging a consultant to guide our progress. We are now at the point of developing resources for 2017 that will support the Achieve programme and be specific for each year group.

As I said in the opening paragraph, Rome was not built in a day. Cultural change takes time and by cultural change I refer to the academic culture of the Secondary School. We are putting in place structures and strategies to ensure the best outcomes for each student. The future looks positive for the Secondary School with planning well advanced for our first Secondary classroom block and the initiatives outlined above well advanced.


#### Environmental Day



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


#### Memorable Visits








# Prep Excursion Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary



# Year 5 Incursion Big Bang



This term we looked at Pop Art, it was fun but also difficult. We still managed to get through it.



### Architects


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In August all Year 8s travelled to the beautiful beaches of the Gold Coast to undertake coastal management fieldtrip. It wasn't without its hiccups as the day started with uncertainty due to storm conditions that hit the coast. Thankfully the trip still went ahead.

Whilst on the pristine beaches of Palm Beach students witnessed firsthand the ferocity a storm can have on a beach. Huge sections of the littoral zone had been washed away caused by destruction waves and powerful winds. Split into teams and with geography kits in hand work commenced on measuring wind speed and direction. Wave height was measured and flora and fauna all noted. The beach was unusually quiet due to the destructive waves and the windy conditions. Not a surfer swimmer or dog walker was in sight.

Next the group hopped on the bus and took a short trip Narrow Neck were the Gold Coast City Council (GCCC) have created an artificial reef. Not only does this reef attract tourists who wish to dive or snorkel, it also protects the beach from pounding waves. This is just one of the coastal management processes the GCCC have in place to protect the coast from erosion.

Finally, the last stop was at the Spit. Again observation of wind speed and direction were noted and flora and fauna identified. The main reason for visiting this site was to see the Beach Nourishment Plant. The aim of beach nourishment is to protect beaches against storm damage and to protect life and property. Sand is pumped and cleaned from the Spit and transported via huge pipes over to South Stradbroke Island. There are a number of benefits achieved from beach nourishment projects such as a wider beach which obviously facilitates more activities. And let's not forget beautiful beaches keep the Gold Coast on the tourist map.

On the way home Grade 8s chirpily talked about their busy day and how they couldn't wait to collate all their primary data into a report.


